Colour Parade: free to take part

All horses/ponies shown on the day can take part, horses/ponies to be paraded in hand or ridden, grouped in colour order (Skewbald, Piebald, Roan, Palomino, Dun & Buckskin, Spotted, Grey, Black, Bay then Chestnut). Parade to go around main arena, then to line up in colour groups, judges will award one wild card pass per colour group to each Colour Championship. The wild card winner will lead their colour group out of the arena. Those already qualified for their Colour Championship to wear their qualification rosette to show the judges that they are not eligible for the wild card pass.

Rosette to Best Evening Outfit

*15 points awarded towards Howe Supreme Points to each taking part in the Colour Parade

Class Championships:

All first and second placed horses/ponies from Rings 1, 2 and 3 to qualify for each Class Championship. If a horse/pony qualifies in both the ridden and in hand in any Championship, the rider can choose to show as either, wearing both rosettes for that section.

Colour Championships:

Highest placed horse/pony of each colour in each class to qualify for the Championship of their specific colour. All 1st placed combinations from each fun class in Ring 4 are eligible to go forward to the Colour Championship specific to their horse/pony.

One wild card pass per Colour Championship to be awarded during Colour Parade.

Champion and Reserve to each of the ten colour groups.

Overall Supreme Championship:

All Champions and Reserve Champions from Class Championships and Colour Championships to come forward, wearing all Champion and Reserve Champion rosettes.

CHAPS (UK)

This show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK).

Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and present their valid Qualifier card IN THE RING for signing by the judge.

Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card.

The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 28th-31st August 2019. Shows held on or after the Postal Entry closing date of Championship Show will count as 2020 qualifiers.

For the 2019 Showing Season, as usual, we will be awarding points as listed below the change this year is that all finalists must have attended at least three of our five shows over the season. Each horse/rider/handler combination must accumulate points over at least three shows to qualify for the Howe Grand Finale at the Anniversary Charity Show.

Combinations achieving 50-75 points will qualify for the Bronze finale, taking part on the day of the Anniversary show to receive a speciality bronze rosette.

The winning Bronze combination will go forward to the Silver finale.

Combinations achieving 75-100 points will qualify for the Silver finale, taking part on the day of the Anniversary show to receive a speciality silver rosette.

The winning Silver combination will go forward to the Gold finale.

Combinations achieving 100 or more points will qualify for the Gold finale, taking part on the day of the Anniversary show to receive a speciality gold rosette. **The winner of the Gold finale, selected by our panel of judges, will be Howe's Supreme of the Year, winning themselves £500 and a further £500 for their chosen charity. Howe's Reserve Supreme of the Year will win themselves £250 and a further £250 for their chosen charity.**

Qualification is for the Horse & Pony except for Adult/Young Handler classes, where the Handler qualifies. TGCA TOYS In Hand and Ridden Classes Show Number TGCA xxxxxxxx

Pure Bred classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show "TOYS". Classes are open to all pure bred traditional gypsy cobs.

Part Bred classes, are open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the part bred finals at "TOYS". The exhibit must have one parent that is pure bred traditional gypsy cob, a minimum of 50% breeding is accepted.

Stallions – All stallions (pure or part bred, four years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class **MUST** have be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, **MUST** be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook.

Existing TGCA members must present their qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature. Non-members will receive a qualification card from the judge and have 21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification. Please refer to www.tgca.co.uk for further details including membership, horse registration and showing rules (contained within the members handbook).

Quest for a Star/Go for Glory Championship Shows

Pure Breds that are placed 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship, **provided** they are current TGCA members and the horse is TGCA registered. Membership cards and qualification cards (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS.

Part Breds that are placed 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the part bred TGCA classes may go forward to the Go for Glory Championship. For 2018 and 2019 qualifiers there is no requirement for membership or registration (apart from stallions) on the date of the show. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championships at TOYS.

2. Highfield at Howe reserve the right to change judges, amalgamate classes and change rings if necessary.
3. Objections must be presented to the secretary within thirty minutes of the incident with twenty pounds which will be refunded if objection is upheld. The judges' decision is final.
4. NO MUCKING OUT ONTO CAR PARK. Fifty pound fine will be enforced on anyone caught.
5. Dogs must be on leads and under close control at all times.
6. Although every effort will be made to accommodate all riders/handlers, it is solely the rider/handlers responsibility to be at the correct ring at the correct time. If classes may clash, please make the ring steward aware, however it is at the judges' discretion if late arrivals are allowed to enter the class. The judges' decision is final.
7. In the interests of safety the warm up arena may be restricted to the next class only, all riders to respect others, ride left to left, and be in control at all times.
8. Any horse or pony considered by an official to be lame or a danger to themselves or others will be asked to retire from the show.
9. If any rider dismounts in a class at an in correct time, falls off or a handler lets go of a horse it is the judges' decision if they may continue in the class. The judges' decision is final.
10. Refund of entry fees is solely at the discretion of Highfield at Howe.
11. Stabling fees are not refundable.
